

School Uniform

We have a school uniform that we actively encourage pupils to wear as we believe our uniform adds to the ethos of the school assisting with good behaviour and fostering a strong feeling of belonging amongst the children.

School uniform is worn by all the pupils and is welcomed by our governors and parents.

Our **school colour** is green.

School uniform consists of the following:

Boys	Dark green jumper/school sweatshirt with crest Formal grey trousers Grey long shorts (summer) White polo shirt with crest Black, low heeled shoes Black or grey plain socks
Hair:	Long fringes covering the eyes are not permitted. Neither are Mohicans/Mohawks, tramlines, cuts shorter than a grade 3, hair colour or excessive gel.
Girls	Dark green cardigan/jumper/ school sweatshirt with crest Grey skirt/pinafore/formal grey culottes White blouse White polo shirt with crest Green and white checked summer dress Black, low heeled shoes White or grey plain socks
Hair:	If longer than a collar length, hair should be fully tied back with a suitable neutral band or head band (or ones in the dark green school colour). Indian braids, multi-colours and beaded hair are not permitted, unless for religious or ethnic reasons that should be discussed with your child's teacher.
PE kit	Green shorts and white school t-shirt with crest.
Games kit	As above, but warmer and more substantial clothing for winter is recommended, including long socks, trainers, jogging suits or sweatshirts. Jogging suits or sweatshirts should be in the school colours only.



Swimming kits	A named costume and towel. A one piece
-	costume and swimming cap MUST be worn by
	all children. Powder, gel and creams for
	medical reasons only.

Occasionally, children lose or misplace articles of clothing. Please help us to locate them easily by **marking all garments** clearly with their full name. Rucksacks, bags, lunch boxes etc. can all look very similar and should also be clearly marked for identification.

Girls or boys should not wear **jewellery** particularly ear-rings to school for health & safety reasons. If studs must be worn, they must be restricted to the small "stud" or "sleeper" type and must be removed before any P.E. sessions.

Lost property

It is the responsibility of the children to look after their uniform. If uniform is misplaced and found, it will be placed in the lost property container by the school gate. Parents should check here if an item has been misplaced. Parents can also check with the school office if items have been lost.

Mobile phones and electronic equipment

Mobile phones are not permitted in school. If your child needs a mobile home because they walk home from school alone, then they must leave it in the office. Other electronic equipment may be brought in with the permission of the class teacher for special occasions. However, we do not accept liability for any items lost, stolen or damaged.

The role of parents

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy by ensuring their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean, clearly labelled and in good repair.

We attempt to allow the children to play outside during all breaks and it is therefore advisable to send them to school well wrapped up against the elements during the **winter** months and protected from the **sun** in the summer term.
