Bringing history to life at Knaphill

As the end of term creeps towards us, many year groups have experienced history immersion days, which are designed to bring history to life, whilst helping children to develop empathy for people in the past.



Last week in Year 4, the children had a Viking Day. During this day, they took part in a range of exciting activities including playing a Viking board game, completing a Viking quiz and exploring a range of Viking artefacts. They also had a brilliant afternoon learning about Viking armour and weapons, battle moves, spear-wrestling, and acting out Ragnarok - a traditional Viking story about the end of the world!

In Year 3 today, the children arrived in their very best Stone Age costumes, ready to experience a day of history immersion. Not only did they look fantastic, with more than a little leopard print involved, but they were excited about their topic learning. By 9am, the children were gathered to embark on a mammoth hunt in our school hall—to me, this seemed like a enjoyable, although quite noisy experience. The rest of the day has been a big success and has helped children to deepen their history knowledge, whist experiencing memorable learning.

Next week, Year 6 have their Victorian immersion day and I will look forward to sharing their learning too.
