Dear Parents and Guardians,

It seems that autumn has crept up on us this week and the mornings are starting to get a little bit more chilly, but all is sunny inside Knaphill. Our children's zest for life and joy of school really does make my day, every day! Just yesterday a visitor who was touring the school, commented on the fantastic behaviour of our children—she noted that they are all very polite, confident, and you can see just how engaged they are in their learning. I agree with this and it is something that can be seen throughout the week.

Reception—outdoor learning

In Reception, I have been getting to know our new children and I have joined them outside twice this week. Firstly, in their Reception outdoor area, where I could see all children engaged in independently learning through play. I was amazed by their understanding of repeating patterns and it was pleased to see that Knaphill has an abundance of worms, which they were carefully investigating and protecting from harm. At Knaphill, we even show kindness and compassion to worms. Yesterday, the Reception children also had their first outdoor learning session in the Woodland Enclave. They were very excited to show me what treasures they had found— "Crunchy leaves, tiny stones, shiny conkers and long sticks." What a great way to practise new vocabulary!

<u>Learning— KS1</u>

I have also been very pleased to be working with the Year 1 and 2 team s for the last few weeks. Our KS1 chil-

dren show incredible learning behaviours and this is reflected in their engagement during lessons. Having seen them in guided reading, English, maths, art and science this week, I can see the learning happening before my very eyes. The changes our teams have made to the curriculum is leading to children making links in their learning, whilst developing a real depth of knowledge. Don't believe me? Test it out for yourself.

Year 1 parents—ask your child to explain the properties of an every day material (wood, metal, glass) and its suitability for different uses. They are little scientists!



Year 2 parents– ask your child to explain the techniques that Van Gogh used to paint his famous Starry Night. These artists know their stuff!

Pupil Parliament

We're very excited to announce that the new Pupil Parliament for 2022-2023 has been formed. A very large number of children across the Junior School made a speech in front of their class, explaining why they thought they would be able to represent their class in our parliament. After the votes were cast and counted, we now have 24 Members of Parliament (2 from each class) who will be working hard to get the opinions of their peers heard.

The Pupil Parliament will have regular meetings where they will decide how they want to improve our school, meet with teachers to discuss topics that are important to their classes, and support their peers in showing the values of our school. We have a wonderful group of MPs this year and can't wait to see the impact they have on our school.

As part of our dedication to keeping our children safe, next week we will be joining the NSPCC to spread the message "Speak Out. Stay Safe." All children at the Junior school will be involved with an online assembly that teaches them how they should be treated by others, what they should do when they don't feel safe and who they can turn to when they are worried. A separate letter has gone out with more information about the assembly and links to advice and support from the NSPCC.

On Wednesday 12th October, Years 5 and 6 will be taking part in workshops run by trained NSPCC workers who will be looking in more detail about looking after themselves and where to turn in times of need.

This week we have continued to review our provision at playtimes and lunchtimes. The large playground has been set up for more active activities such as football, basketball, the playframe and we have just purchased four table tennis tables; which are proving a great hit with the children. The smaller playground has more structured, quieter games and areas for children to sit and chat. We have also opened a lunch club where children can be in a still quieter, inside environment for the last half an hour of lunchtime. This is being run by our Family Link Worker, Mrs Phillips and many children are benefitting from this provision.

On Thursdays and Fridays, Mr Greenwood is taking a girls team and a boys team to train on the field. Again, this has been hugely successful. We have a traverse wall ordered... watch this space!
