It was pretty hard to miss our amazing mobile caving system, which appeared in the playground yesterday morning, and it was even harder to miss the buzz of excitement as the children left school talking about it! During the day, all of our children had the opportunity to find their way through the cave, complete with hard hats, head torches and knee pads. Not only was this a great adventure and a memorable new experience, which promotes physical activity, but it also allowed the children to show courage in the face of something that was unknown and perhaps a little scary. All the staff were raving about the courage their classes displayed and the determination this children showed. I was also impressed by the determination of our staff who took on the challenge, a challenge that is a little harder when you are adult sized!

DT in Year 1 and Year 2

I have been very inspired by our young designers this week in our DT lessons. In Year 1, the children were applying their science knowledge from last week to design and test their own parachutes. They were able to justify their choice of materials and could even ex-

plain the idea of air flow.

These learning skills were also shown by our Year 2 children is







their work around strong, stable structures. Even as young designers they were able to compare different wall structures, which they tested using Lego bricks and recorded using a design template. We can see that our new curriculum is creating learning for life and perhaps may spark a future career for some of our children.
