
#### **Dear Parents and Guardians,**

#### What we've achieved this week

#### Growth mindset in Action

We continued the next part of our growth mindset journey, this week by once again joining Mojo the Dojo as he learns about the importance of making mistakes and learning from them. #### Year 1 Geography Trip

On Monday, our Year 1 children headed off on a geography walk around Knaphill. Our staff were very impressed by the behaviour of the children as they represented our school in the local community and they felt they were very sensible when walking next to the road. During this trip, our children asked "What is this place like?", which is a key objectives of our early geography curriculum. They also tested out their walk instructions that they had written as a class.





#### Anti-bullying/ friendship week:

It was a very important week this week—Anti-bullying and friendship week. On Monday, we started off by appreciating our unique differences by wearing odd socks and we ended the week by wearing spots for Children in Need. As well as this, during our lessons and assemblies this week, our children have looked at the importance of friendship and what skills are needed to be a good friend. Although we focused on this key learning this week, these messages continue throughout our curriculum all year round.

#### Year 1 night walk:

On Thursday next week, we have invited our Year 1 children to return to school with their parents for a Night Walk. The children will spend their English lessons applying their instruction writing skills to writing their own Night Walk instructions for their parents to follow. 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#### Value of the week: Curiosity

Children have been learning more about our value of curiosity and how a desire to know and find out supports a growth mindset. Children in assembly heard the story of two seeds – both planted on the same day, in the same soil, in the same garden bed. One seed had a growth mindset—with a curious desire to grow and reach the outside world—while the other had a fixed mindset, which was filled with fear and choosing to remain stagnant in its soil. We have reviewed and reflected with our children on the characteristics of a fixed mindset and a growth mindset, teaching children to appreciate their mistakes and failures as these enable learning to happen.

#### **Extreme Reading**

We began our Extreme Reading Challenge for Years 3-6 this week, and it continues next week.
