What we've achieved this week

Staff Training—Growth Mindset

On Monday, all of our staff intended an inspiring training session, which was led by Miss Shan and Mr Stroud, and focused on the importance of a growth mindset. After learning about the relevant research in this area and the impact this has had in different schools



around the country, we then put together our vision and a plan for implementing a growth mindset approach at Knaphill Lower School.

Phase one of our plan looks at the focus on effort over achievement; helping children to understand the parts of their brain and the importance of understanding the difference between a fixed and growth mindset. On Wednesday, I then decided that I would show the children my juggling skills, although I had forgotten that I can't (YET!) juggle. The children were supportive and Frankie, in Year 1, reminded me that "I couldn't do it yet, but I need to practise more like she has done with her gymnastics." After listening to Frankie's advice, I remembered a book that could help us—Giraffe's Can't Dance. This book helped us to understand that

our mindset is important and an unexpected visit from Gerald the Giraffe clarified this on Thursday. The task for next week is for us all the understand what a fixed and growth mindset is and we will explore this in all our assemblies and PSHE lessons.

What's happening next week

Next week, Year 2 are heading off on a brand new trip to support their topic—the Great and The Ghastly. On Tuesday, they will travel to London to observe the skyline of our capital from the London Eye. They will then take a cruise along the river to see it from a different point of view. This trip will support their understanding of history, but also will provide an opportunity for them to paint the skyline in the style of Van Gogh.
