


Weekly Update : Knaphill Junior School

When talking to the parents, Sharon made them aware of how to keep their children safe using settings on devices, trends and current apps that are being used by young people and how to have conversations with their young people about staying safe online.

- Make a set of family rules. E.g. How long they can be on devices. What they are allowed access to. An evening of no devices for anyone in the family.
