Our Summer term is already looking exciting, please see our attached and updated dates document for more information. Have a lovely Easter Break and we will see you on Monday 17th April!


> _____ Zones of Regulation

At times, even as adults, it can be hard to recognise and regulate our emotions, . However, this is especially challenging for young children as they develop emotional literacy skills. To support children with this, and to get them in the right mindset for learning, we have introduced the Zones of Regulation to help us understand our

emotions. So far, we have covered the blue, green and yellow zones and what emotions these include. We will be providing a video introduction for parents after Easter.

When we return, we will continue looking at the Zones of Regulation and will be giving our children strategies that they can independently use to get back into the Green Learning Zone. For more information please visit this link.

Top tip: At home, start referring to yourself being in a zone. "I am feeling in the blue zone this morning



because I am tired." This role modelling support children's understanding of emotions.

He showed confidence in explaining that he has been practising his defensive moves.


Keeping working hard!

Notices:

Attendance:

It is extremely important that children are in school and their attendance remains as high as possible. Just to remind parents/carers that, in line with other Surrey schools, if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a penalty notice.

Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.
