### A word from Miss Harbridge:



### Notices:

#### Pokémon cards

Moving forward, we would like to discourage children from bringing Pokémon Cards (or other trading cards) into school. The trading of these cards often leads to children feeling upset after unfair trades are made. We are also concerned that they are becoming a distraction from learning. If these cards do come into school, they will be

looked after by Miss Harbridge and can be collected at the end of the day. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

### Attendance:

It is extremely important that children are in school and their attendance remains as high as possible. Just to remind parents/carers that, in line with other Surrey schools, if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a penalty notice.

Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.
