longer need and would consider donating to school? Our children would be very happy to receive it. Please send all donations to the school office.





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
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




Parent Survey results

My child feels safe at this school.




3. The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.




4. My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively.



5. The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.




6. When I have raised concerns with the school they have dealt with it properly.








