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### Transition

The prospect of moving to a new class with a new teacher can be really exciting for many for us. However, for some, the knowledge that change is looming can also cause anxiety, apprehension and angst. Over the next few weeks, we will continue to provide some ideas and resources which you might find useful in supporting your child, if they are finding the prospect of change a challenge.

Please remember that every child is different, and what is helpful for one child, might not be helpful for another. You know your child best.

### Same and Different

Many of us find change difficult, because change brings uncertainty. For some children, their anxiety around transition may be reduced by acknowledging exactly what will be different in September and offsetting this by also thinking about all the things that will stay the same.

Attached to this week's newsletter is a blank 'Same and Different' worksheet. Work with your child to list all the things that will be different in September. For every thing that you think of that will be different, try and think of something that will stay the same.

Talk through the 'Different' list with your child and provide as much information about these changes as you can. Remind your child of times that they have dealt with similar changes in the past.
