Each year group covered a different topic.


We take our value of **responsibility** seriously by ensuring that children and our parents are offered the opportunity to learn how to keep safe online.

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Attendance:

It is extremely important that children are in school and their attendance remains as high as possible. Just to remind parents/carers that, in line with other Surrey schools, if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a penalty notice.

Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

Reading Assembly Recommendation from Mrs. Shaw


Mrs. Shaw shared her love of 'The Magician's Nephew' by C.S. Lewis. During this week's reading assembly.


