Attendance Cup


At Knaphill School, we take attendance seriously as it is crucial to our pupils' success. We are thrilled to announce Sycamore this week's winners of the Attendance Cup.



- Would you recommend this book to a friend? Why?












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Anti-Bullying Week & Children in Need
