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Working Together to Improve Reading

With so many children's books being released in time for Christmas, it can be challenging to keep up-to-date with new brilliant authors.

Here are some new authors you may not have heard of before, who have written some wonderful books which could capture your child's interest and ignite their love of reading,

<u>Year 3</u>

The Puffin Keeper- Michael Morpurgo

Chapter book

Originally published in November 2020, this month sees the gorgeous new paperback edition of The Puffin Keeper by Michael Morpurgo and Benji Davies.

The Puffin Keeper is a beautiful story of friendship, love, family, hope and new beginnings, which pays homage to memories of family holidays to the Scilly Isles and is set alongside Benji Davies' colour illustrations that evoke the untamed coastal setting, the character's passion for painting and the value of passing time in bringing relationships to blossom through life's differing seasons.



Year 4



The topic of polar exploration is a popular one in primary schools with teachers and pupils easily being able to reel off a list of famous arctic explorers: Shackleton, Scott, Cook, Peary. But how often do you hear the name Matthew Henson among the list, the man who travelled with Captain Peary and claimed to be the first to reach the North Pole? In Race to the Frozen North, best-selling author Catherine Johnson offers a fictionalised retelling of Matthew Henson's story, including how his achievements were unfairly suppressed for decades because of the colour of his skin. Published in Barrington Stoke's 'super-readable' and dyslexia-friendly style, this is an accessible read for children in KS2.







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<u>Year 5</u> Ella on the Outside - Cath Howe

Chapter book

Ella on the Outside is a superbly honest debut from Cath Howe, with authentic characters and important themes of friendship, loyalty, selfacceptance and parental responsibility. For me this was a thoroughly enjoyable read and I'm convinced the characters will resonate strongly with lots of readers. As well as the themes of friendship and loyalty, the book also addresses issues of parental responsibility, childhood eczema, mental health and the impact of having an absent parent. This is a gripping and emotive read filled with heart and we recommend it for readers in upper KS2... CATH HOWE

A highly-recommended story with themes of family bonds, parental mental health and marine conservation. The tale highlights the topic of environmental sustainability but also draws a picture of the wonderful connection that can develop between children and animals, placing hope and empowerment in the hands of the young to make a difference in the planet's future.
