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Working Together to Improve Reading

With so many children's books being released in time for Christmas, it can be challenging to keep up-to-date with new brilliant authors.

Here are some more new authors you may not have heard of before, who have written some wonderful books which could capture your child's interest and ignite their love of reading,

Year 3

The Creakers - Tom Fletcher & Shane Devries

Chapter book

An adventure story that fans of Roald Dahl will enjoy. The story revolves around the plight of a girl named Lucy, who has been left distraught after her parents suddenly go missing. Lucy soon finds that all of the children on her street seem to be facing the same fate – with their parents disappearing as well. Consequently, the children embark on a rampage, causing havoc in houses and on the street, throwing toilet paper on trees, and creating a mess everywhere. Lucy is a natural-born leader as well as an instinctive problem solver. Amid the chaos, Lucy takes it upon herself to investigate and locate the missing parents. In her quest for answers, she discovers a mysterious creature called Woleb from the world of Creakers, hidden under her bed.

A thrilling adventure follows as the pair try to uncover the truth behind the strange happenings. Most children have wondered at some time or other if there is another world under their bed, and this story makes a lighthearted fantasy out of a common fear. A brave adventure story coupled with likeable characters and good clean humour makes this a popular choice with Year 3 at storytime.



Year 4

Clifftoppers: The Arrowhead Moor Adventure - Fleur Hitchcock

Chapter book

A classic adventure story with plenty of action and daring rescues topped off with a good helping of home-baked scones. Four cousins – Aiden, Ava, Chloe and Josh – are staying with their grandparents along with their pet dog, Bella, at a farmhouse in the country. After nearly getting knocked down by a fast car during a bike ride one day, they discover the woman who narrowly missed them has more to hide than just her bad driving. After overhearing a suspicious conversation outside a sinisterlooking country pub, they decide to follow her and in so doing stumble upon a trail of missing royal diamonds, some stolen sheep and a gang of dangerous, daring jewel thieves. A thrilling chase across the moors ensues, complete with swirling mist, dangerous bogs and even a spot of breaking and entering. Will the cousins be able to track down the missing diamonds?





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<u>Year 5</u> <u>The Boy Who Saved a Bear - Nizrana Farook & David Dean</u> Chapter book

Set in a Sri Lanka, this adventure story tells the story of a friendship between a boy and a bear.

During his work as a deliverer of books, a boy called Nuwan mistakenly comes to possess a valuable key that implicates him in a crime. On the run, he befriends a terrifying bear and before long the pair find themselves on a thrilling adventure during which they must unlock big secrets, stop the criminals and find their way safely home again.



<u>Year 6</u> Show Us Who You Are - Elle McNicoll

Chapter book

This story follows twelve-year-old Cora, who describes herself as autistic, as she befriends a boy called Adrien at a party that she never wanted to go to. A little unwilling at first, Cora is used to distrusting others and feels sure that Adrien's intentions are unlikely to be driven by genuine interest in her. In no time at all, Cora learns to trust Adrien, who confides in her about his own ADHD, and as the pair become close they enjoy each other's unquestioning acceptance and bond over their experiences of not quite fitting in at school.

Adrien's Dad runs a company called 'Pomegranate Technologies', and Cora finds herself drawn to their innovative programme of creating incredibly lifelike holograms (or 'grams') of people. Having recently lost her own mother, the idea of being able to interact with a loved one after they die appeals instantly. Cora is intrigued to discover that scientists at the institute are keen to interview her as a 'person with autism', and after an unexpected event happens with Adrien she agrees to help. Before long, Cora notices something amiss with one of the grams and begins to unravel some surprising truths about what is really going on behind the scenes at Pomegranate...

A member of the Woking School Nursing Team is available every Wednesday between 9.30am and 11.30am (including holidays) at the Child Health Drop-In at Eastwood Leisure Centre, Albert Drive, Sheerwater, Woking GU21 SRF.

They are available to answer questions from parents/carers of school aged children and to give advice, information and signpost on topics including early toileting, sleep, behaviour, healthy diet, dental care, school readiness, NCMP heights & weights, mental health, eating disorders, minor illnesses, internet safety and much more.

They can also help with referrals to other services.

Just drop-in, no appointment necessary, there is a soft play area if you have a younger child and space to sit and have a coffee. Free parking at the venue.
