
Attendance Cup

In the Summer term, our Artist of the Term was Alma Thomas. Best known for making abstract art, her paintings were bright and colourful and were influenced by the natural world.








School Photos - Reminder




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
Mental Health Awareness Week


Monday 20th May - Friday 24th May We will be reflecting upon well-being and mental health next week.

Books that acknowledge or explore mental health issues can help to increase awareness, encourage dialogue, reduce stigma and develop real understanding.










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Working Together to Improve Attendance

What YOU should do:

Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence. Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters. If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival. Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport, call on a family member, neighbour or friend. If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

Check your child's attendance every day. Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you. Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned. If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.
