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Restorative and Relational Practice

Our whole school approach to guiding behaviour at Knaphill School follows 'Relational and Restorative Practice'

We are passionate about the importance of building good relationships with staff, pupils and parents. Across our whole school community, we have adopted a culture of using positive relationships to resolve conflict and repair harm.

Emphasis is placed on building meaningful and respectful relationships and mutual trust.

Every member of staff in our school is trained in this practice.

Our children are then empowered to be involved in decisions that affect them, and more likely to make positive and lasting changes in their lives.

Classes have daily check-in and check-out circles to build relationships.

Where there has been conflict, children are guided through a restorative conversation:

What happened?

Everyone has a unique and valued perspective - everyone is listened to

Who has been affected?

How have they been affected?

What needs to happen now to put it right?

Children are never guided to say sorry, but supported in repairing relationships through their actions (How can they put it right?)

What can we do to help?

How can we make sure this doesn't happen again?

All conversation end with the question - Do you think this has been resolved/dealt with?

- 6. Once on the internet, type in the search box Google Classroom and select the appropriate link
- 7. Select Go to Classroom, then log in using school login and password.






Year 4

of individuality, imagination, and eccentricity.








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Turtle Moon


