




A lovely book about the transition to school. This is the perfect book for discussing the feelings that parents and children might feel and provides strategies for how to manage these feelings.





Year 2 - Florence Nightingale Workshop



In our Year 4 English lesson, we were immersed in an enquiry experience that hooked us into our new key text by exploring a rainforest under threat from human activity. Using a range of clues such as images, sounds, and written evidence, we acted as investigators to make inferences about the impact humans are having on this precious environment. Deep-thinking questions helped the children to explore the clues closely, sparking their curiosity and encouraging them to think beyond the obvious. This engaging start to our new text allowed us to build background knowledge, make connections, and get excited about the story ahead.



Attendance Policy

We are taking this further opportunity to share our Attendance Policy with you that came in to effect on Monday 19th August 2024. As you will be aware, our Attendance Policy was amended to include the new procedures, as directed by the Department for Education (DfE) and can be found on our school website.

Please note that the main changes are listed below:

If you take your child/ren out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- 1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Any leave of absence for absences from Monday 19th August 2024, will follow the new procedures.

In line with the new DfE guidance, we are now obligated to request medical evidence and flight/holiday confirmation when an illness occurs just prior or after a holiday request.
