UK Parliament Week at Knaphill Junior School

This week, our students have been exploring the fascinating world of politics as part of UK Parliament Week. Politics is all about how people make decisions on living together in a society and working towards common goals. Of course, not everyone agrees on what those goals should be or how to achieve them and that's where discussion and democracy come in!

On Monday 24th November, Year 6 had a visit from our local MP for Woking, Will Forster.

This was a great way to begin our UK Parliament Week, in which children learnt how

Parliament works, linking into our focus on British Values of the Rule of Law and

Democracy. Will gave us an overview of what his role consists of, why he became an MP, the most interesting and the most bizarre parts of his role, as well as what makes Woking such a special place to live. Children then had nearly an hour of questions, which had to only be cut short because it was lunchtime!

Year 6's questions and behaviour showed maturity, and they were a credit to our school.



Over five days, each class has taken part in activities designed to build understanding of how our country is governed:

Day 1 - What is Politics?

We started by asking the big question: What does politics mean? Students learned that politics shapes the rules and decisions that affect our daily lives.

Day 2 - The UK Parliament

Pupils discovered the role of Parliament, how it represents the people, and why it's central to democracy.

Day 3 - Elections and Voting

We explored how elections work and why voting matters. Students even held their own mini-election to experience the process firsthand.

Day 4 - How Laws Are Made

From ideas to legislation, students followed the journey of a law through Parliament, understanding how debate and compromise play a part.

Day 5 - Change: What Can You Do?

Finally, we looked at how individuals can make a difference—whether by writing to an MP, joining a campaign, or simply staying informed.

The Knaphill Remembrance Day Service

On Tuesday 11th November, a group of children attended the Knaphill Remembrance Day service. These children had entered a whole school poetry competition and their poems were selected because of the excellent standard. The children confidently read their poetry in front of a crowd of local people, our Chair of Governors, local councillors and our local MP, Will Forster. Mrs Bowry and Mrs Shaw were extremely proud of how the children delivered their work and many people complimented the quality of poetry, as well as the excellent behaviour. We were also fortunate to see an outdoor exhibition of World War Two memorabilia, including a fence screw, which contained a secret wartime message!

Our Year 2 London Adventure!

As part of our topic 'The Great and The Ghastly', Year 2 enjoyed an incredible day in London! The trip gave the children the opportunity to explore how the city has changed over time, discover its famous landmarks, and use the stunning views as inspiration for Van Gogh-style landscape art. Highlights of the day included a bird's-eye View from the London Eye and a Riverboat Cruise along the Thames. Children took part in activities to locate and categorise London's main physical and human features, linking them to the capital's rich history.

It was a memorable experience that combined geography, history, and art in one fantastic day!











Year 2 - Let in Snow!

Our Forest School session today was truly magical! The snowfall didn't stop us from heading outdoors—in fact, it made the experience even more exciting. The children loved running between the snowflakes and trying to catch them as they fell.

We spent time exploring natural materials such as sticks, leaves, moss, rocks and bark. The children discussed which materials would be strong enough or soft enough to build shelters for our Forest School creatures. They shared ideas about how to make the shelters stable and weatherproof, showing fantastic problem-solving and teamwork.

Also we played some fun games to keep warm and then gathered around the fire for a cup of hot chocolate—a perfect way to end our snowy adventure!

We also learned a new skill—how to tie a clove hitch knot!

Year 3 Become Fossil Hunters!

This term, our budding scientists in Year 3 embarked on an exciting journey through time! They explored the fascinating process of fossilisation, discovering how ancient plants and animals leave their mark in different types of rock.

But the adventure didn't stop there—our young paleontologists rolled up their sleeves and created their very own fossils! Using their knowledge and creativity, they crafted replicas and then took on the role of archaeologists, carefully excavating their hidden treasures.

It was a hands-on experience that brought science to life and sparked curiosity about the



What have Year 4 been up to?!

Science you can feel and see...... Year 4 explored the invisible world of sound waves! In our science, we explored the idea that sound is created by vibrations. Using simple, everyday materials, we were able to see what we normally only hear. Through activities such as stretching rubber bands, making grains of rice "dance" on a drum skin, and feeling sound through string, we observed how different objects move when sound waves travel through them. It was a hands-on, noisy, and engaging




Year 4 took part in a variety of activities to celebrate friendship week including:

Year 5 - A trip to Winston Churchill School

Winston Classics Day

On Tuesday 18th November, ten children from year five went to Winston Churchill School for a classics taster day. Our first activity was Greek mythology. We learnt about the story of Icarus and we wrote our own short stories with morals.

Next, we went into the Planetarium and we learnt the names of different stars such as Ursa Major Ursa Minor and Orion. We also learnt different stories about those stars. Then at the end we learnt how to find different stars using the North star. We learnt that one star, the North Star, always stays where it is. It was really fun.

After that, we did Latin We learnt different meanings for words such as octopus in English is eight feet and hippopotamus is river horse. As our activity, we created our own mythical creatures using different Latin words to make new words. There were so many different combinations!

Lastly, we did Roman Numerals. We solved codebreakers that we then realised were in Latin! When we got the translation we had learnt a sentence in Latin. Cogito ergo sum means I think therefore I am. It was incredibly fun and we learnt a lot of new things.

At the end we had learnt so much and it was very interesting.Latin,mythology,Roman numerals and even a touch of astronomy.

Year 6 - Victorian Day





Year 3 - The Magic Faraway Tree: A Christmas Adventure Jacqueline Wilson (author), Mark Beech (illustrator)



Join Anisha, Accidental Detective, for a festive mystery packed with snowmen, secrets, crackers, and clues!



Attendance Policy

We are taking this further opportunity to share our Attendance Policy with you. As you will be aware, our Attendance Policy was amended to include the new procedures, as directed by the Department for Education (DfE) and can be found on our school website.

Please note that the main changes are listed below:

If you take your child/ren out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- 1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

In line with the new DfE guidance, we are now obligated to request medical evidence and flight/holiday confirmation when an illness occurs just prior or after a holiday request.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

At Knaphill Schools, we value every child's learning and wellbeing, and regular attendance plays a vital role in their success. We understand that, on rare occasions, exceptional circumstances may require a leave of absence, and we aim to support families while maintaining high standards for attendance.

Leave of Absence

Requests for leave of absence due to exceptional circumstances will not be approved if additional leave is taken immediately before or after the requested period without prior consent.

If required, proof of travel arrangements (such as flight details) or other supporting documentation must be provided.

Should a period of illness occur directly before or after an approved absence, medical evidence will be requested.

Thank you for working with us to ensure your child's education remains uninterrupted and successful. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us.
